



COACH AND PLAYER EJECTION FORM – (Revised 11/24/08)

OFFICIAL/UMPIRE:

If you find it necessary to eject a coach, player, parent/guardian, or spectator from an athletic contest, it is your responsibility to call your designated association representative immediately following the game, and follow that call by either faxing or emailing this form to the CIFSDS Office and to your association representative within 12 hours of the ejection. It does not matter if: (1) The coach is a head coach or an assistant; (2) The level is varsity, JV, or Frosh; or (3) The team is from the San Diego Section or not.

IF YOU EJECT ANY INDIVIDUAL, YOU MUST FOLLOW THE ABOVE PROCEDURES

DEFINITION - GROSS UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT EJECTION

A student-athlete, coach, parent/guardian, or spectator who, prior to, during, or following an interscholastic athletic contest commits an act of malicious nature toward a contest official or an opponent shall be guilty of gross unsportsmanlike conduct. Such acts shall include, but not be limited to, maliciously cursing at, striking, or threatening an official; physical contact with an opponent that is beyond the normal scope of competition and which appears to be with the intent of inflicting bodily harm on the opponent; spitting on or at a contest official or opponent; directing ethnic, racial, or gender slurs toward a contest official or opponent; or other such acts that may be deemed “grossly” unacceptable conduct by the game official.

ALL GROSS UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT EJECTIONS

- Any person ejected for an act of gross unsportsmanlike conduct will be subject to the following penalty:
- **In all team sports**, with the exception of football, the penalty will be **ejection from that contest and a six (6) game/match suspension.**
 - **In the sport of football**, the penalty will be **ejection from that contest and a three (3) game suspension.**
 - Established CIFSDS appeals procedures will be adhered to. The game official may appear at the appeal hearing and is expected to provide a detailed account in writing of all events relating to the ejection to the CIFSDS Commissioner.
 - Any person ejected is required to complete the next scheduled Sportsmanship Meeting. If next scheduled meeting is not attended, the ejected person will be ineligible until a meeting is attended.
 - Ejected student-athlete may practice with his/her team.

ALL OTHER EJECTIONS

- Anytime a student-athlete, coach, parent/guardian, or spectator is ejected from an interscholastic athletic contest for any reason other than “gross unsportsmanlike conduct,” the penalty will be ejection from that contest and the next game/match subject to the following:
- A one-game (1) suspension may **not** be appealed.

- Any person ejected is required to complete the next scheduled Sportsmanship Meeting. If next scheduled meeting is not attended, the ejected person will be ineligible until a meeting is attended.

- Ejected student-athlete may practice with his/her team.
- Ejected student-athlete may not suit-up at game/match from which her/she is suspended.

ALL INDIVIDUAL SPORTS EJECTIONS

- Penalty for Gross Unsportsmanlike Conduct Ejection is a suspension for remainder of the contest and suspension in the next two (2) scheduled contests (dual meets, tournaments, invitationals, etc.)
- All Other Ejections would require one (1) event suspension.
- Any person ejected is required to complete the next scheduled Sportsmanship Meeting. If next scheduled meeting is not attended, the ejected person will be ineligible until a meeting is attended.
- Ejected student-athlete may practice with his/her team.
